Telcome to Children's Chorus of Maryland's 33rd Annual Winter Concert, Wintersong! This afternoon's concert is a collection of pieces reflecting on unique elements of the season.

Winter is a celebratory season, and we share with you songs that reflect a spirit of expectancy and joy. Imagine a Chanukah dreidel spinning faster and faster as each new voice enters Dr. Betty Bertaux's arrangement of the Hebrew song S'vivon! Transport yourself to England's countryside and listen for every available church bell to toll on Christmas Day in the carol Ding Dong Merrily on High. Remember and marvel at Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s great vision and accomplishments during the civil rights movement song Light of Mine. And recall the delicious smells and tastes of Thanksgiving as the Lyric Choir sings Over the River and Through the Woods.

At this time of year, we also enjoy the magic of the first snowfall, which has given many poets reason to stop and reflect. In *Velvet Shoes*, Elinor Wylic comments on snow's purity



and delicacy. During the introduction of Randall Thompson's setting of her poem, listen for nature's trumpets announcing snow's arrival, then walk quietly with us in the woods as we relish its beauty. But don't forget the icy cold winds that come with snow! As the Treble Choir sings a text from Kenneth Grahame's *A Wind in the Willows*, you'll remember how fun yet frigid caroling outside can be!

Also during this season, we offer music based on sacred and other highly honored texts. In *Al Shlosha D'Varim*, hear the Lyric Choir sing a Hebrew reflection on three world-sustaining ideals: truth, justice, and peace. Later, the Concert Choir will sing a prayer from 8th century plainchant, set by Lajos Bardos, that praises and then pleads with the Virgin Mary to bestow blessing. And finally, enjoy young, resonant voices energetically sing words of hope: "How good and pleasant it is when brothers live together in harmony."

Let us enter the season of winter with joyful anticipation, respect for nature's beauty, and with a quiet, hopeful spirit. May the songs of winter fill you with peace and refresh your soul.



# GUEST PERFORMERS

Ms. Frances Borowsky started performing at a young age and has played in many places around the world. Upon winning the Erick Friedman Prize for Outstanding Young Musicians at the age of 12, together with her brother and sister, she was invited to perform her New York Debut at Carnegie Hall in 2004. This past spring, Frances and her family performed pre-Olympic concerts with the Tianjin Symphony Orchestra. Most recently, she performed Beethoven's Triple Concerto with the Young German Symphony Orchestra together with her siblings as soloist in Philadelphia, Gettysburg, Baltimore, and New York.

Versatile musician Mr. Jonathan Jensen plays many instruments including percussion, mandolin, banjo and tin whistle—all of which he has played on stage with the Baltimore Symphony Orchestra. Although his primary orchestral instrument is the bass, he often doubles on keyboards and is an accomplished arranger and composer. He also plays piano for contra/English country dances and performs with the Baltimore Mandolin Quartet. Before joining the Baltimore Symphony, he held the position of Principal Bass with the Winnipeg Symphony Orchestra in Canada. Mr. Jensen is married to writer Lynn Jensen and their daughter Fiona is a member of the Concert Choir.

Ms. Jessica Stephen currently teaches Vocal General Music, chorus and steel drums at Havre de Grace Elementary School in Havre de Grace, Maryland. A native of Baltimore, Ms. Stephen graduated from Towson University with a Bachelor's degree in Music Education; her primary instrument was flute. She teaches privately out of her home and is involved in various musical groups in the Baltimore area.


